## Project Summary

### Problem

Address the gap caused by specialization of surgical workforce that impacts surgeons' ability to perform the most common types of surgery required in the field.

### Proposed Solution

Develop the business case for an Intersectional Surgical Training Centre, an eight-week in-field program to train surgeons in the most common surgeries in the field. Target national and international MSF surgeons, anesthesia providers, and OT nurses



### Potential Impact

- Improve safety and quality of surgical care
- Bridge HR-gaps in Surgery and Anesthesia
- Increase retention of international and national surgical staff
- Foster knowledge exchange
- Validate skills and protocols

### Viability

- Builds a business case for implementation
- Incorporates a test-and-learn approach

### Risk Mitigation

- Builds upon a proof of concept approach
- Engages external partnerships

### Scalability

- Approach could be scaled across multiple centres as well as additional capabilities
